BY - LAW NO. 4

(Section 18~~9~~ Municipalities Act)

A By-Law respecting water services

Be IT ENACTED by the Village of Aroostook Junction as follows:

1. There shall be paid to the Municipality in each and every month by the owner of land by which the service line runs, a sum of money as hereinafter determined, to be known as the rates for water services.

2. (a) Such sum shall be due and payable on the last day of each month.

(b) Interest of 1.5% per month shall be charged on any accounts overdue.

3. There will be a hook-up charge of \$250.00 provided the Town has extended a connecting water line to the property line of the land owner.

4. The rates for water shall be determined by Council at the first regular meeting of the month of November each year.

5. Any rates for water services may be charged in the name of the owner of the premises served, and where the occupier of the building is not the owner of the land upon which the building is situated, then the Village shall notify the owner of the land, in writing, within sixty days after the user-charge rates become due and payable.

6. (a) The Village may refuse to connect and may disconnect a user line with the Municipal water lines, unless the installations on the user's property are according to the provisions of any regulations or By-Law made under Section 171 of the Municipality Act or any code adopted by the Municipality with reference to this By-Law.

(B) The Village will supply the corporation and curb stops. The owner of the property will be responsible for their own installation of water service. Any curb stops larger than $3/4$ inch size will be subject to approval by Council.

7. In the event that it shall be necessary for the Municipality to take collection or other legal action to recover any rates due for water services by any user, the user shall be responsible for and liable to payment of the collection charges and legal fees and disbursements in addition to over-due interest.

8. The pipe to be used from the curb stops to the occupied dwelling to be $3/4$ inch ~~or larger~~, copper, ^{or} galvanized type. If any pipe freezes, it is the sole responsibility of the owner to thaw it .

9. The Water Commission will have the right to shut off the water after six months if no payments are received.

10. The Water Commission will consist of the current elected members of the Village Council.

11. By-Law 6 and any amendments thereto previously in force is hereby repealed.

12. This By-Law comes into force on the date of final passing thereof.

AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAW #4

A BY-LAW RESPECTING WATER SERVICES

BE IT ENACTED BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF AROOSTOOK AS FOLLOWS:

1. Definitions:

In this by-law amendments:

- (a) "cross connection" means a connection or a potential connection between any part of a potable water system and any other environment containing other substances in a manner which, under any circumstances, could allow such substances to enter the potable water system,
- (b) "customer's water system" means a water system owned by a person other than the Water Commission but which receives water from the Water Commission water system,
- (c) "owner" means any person, firm or corporation controlling the property under consideration,
- (d) "water" and "water supply" means the water supplied to consumers for the purposes herein specified,

2. The Aroostook Water Commission will have the right to restrict water use in times of low water levels as determined by the Water Commission upon public notice of low water levels in the local newspaper.

3. The Aroostook Water Commission will have the right to shut off the water if in the opinion of the Water Commission that excessive use or waste of water is occurring.

4. (a) Water shall not be furnished for any purpose other than domestic and fire protection purposes when in the opinion of the Water Commission the quality or efficiency of the water supply for domestic and fire protection purposes within the village would be thereby impaired.
- (b) The Water Commission may, subject to the foregoing limitations, furnish water for purposes other than domestic and fire protection purposes under an agreement in writing that the water supply may be discontinued temporarily or permanently by the Water Commission.

5. The locations, elevations, materials and methods of installation for all public and private water and sewer mains, service pipes, and appurtenances shall be approved by the Aroostook Water Commission prior to their construction.
6. Where a customer's water system is found to have been installed in an unworkmanlike manner or in a manner insufficiently strong to resist the pressure to which it may be subjected or where a person supplied with water has violated any provision of this bylaw, the Aroostook Water Commission may direct that the water supply be discontinued until such customer's water system is properly installed and approved and the person supplied has complied with the provisions of this bylaw.
7. No connections shall be made to the water system for the purpose of taking water therefrom except under the direct supervision of the Aroostook Water Commission or other person duly authorized by the Aroostook Water Commission for the purpose.
8. (1) At the time of making application for a water service connection the owner shall deposit with the Aroostook Water Commission an amount equal to the estimated cost of installing the water service pipe or replacing the same as the case may be.
(2) The amount deposited shall be credited to the cost of the work and should such cost exceed the amount of the deposit, the owner shall pay the difference to the Aroostook Water Commission before the water supply is activated, but should the deposit exceed the cost of the work the surplus shall be refunded to the owner.
9. (1) No owner or other person shall connect, cause to be connected, or allow to remain connected, any piping, fixture, fitting, container or appliance, in a manner which, under any circumstances, could allow water, waste water, or any other substance to enter the village's water system.
(2) If a condition is found to exist which in the opinion of the Water Commission is contrary to subsection (1) hereof, the Water Commission may either:
 - (a) shut off the service or services, or
 - (b) give notice to the customer to correct the fault within a specified period.

9. (c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Aroostook Water Commission may permit a shut off valve to be installed on the customer's water piping at the sources of potential contamination and/or on the water service pipe on new installations.

10. Where, in the opinion of the Aroostook Water Commission a high risk of contamination of the potable water system exists, or the potential contaminant is extremely dangerous, water service to a customer shall be provided only on the provision that the customer have installed on the customer's water service pipe a cross connection control device approved by the Aroostook Water Commission in addition to the cross connection control devices installed on the customer's water piping at the source of potential contamination.


11. (1) No owner whose premises are served by the water system shall use any alternate source of water supply without consent of the Aroostook Water Commission.
(2) No person shall allow an alternate source of water supply to be connected to the water system.
(3) Violation of the above herein by the owner or user incurs costs to the owner of decontamination of the water supply to meet the specifications of the public health inspector.

12. These amendments are enacted on the date of the final reading thereof.



Water Service Policy concerning Frozen Water Pipes

November 18, 2015

By-Law #4, Respecting Water Services- Original by-law.

Whereas: Section 8 of above by-law states:

“If any pipe freezes, it is the sole responsibility of the owner to thaw it.”

Whereas Amendment to By law no.4, Section 8 A states:

“In the event that any home owner’s water freezes, and the home owner, after trying to have the water thawed, and fails to do so, the Town will supply pipe and a man to hook up temporary water services. This is providing that the homeowner does all inside work that is necessary.”

Policy is to add to the above:

In the event that any home owner that has a water overflow and the water service freezes after they have been notified by letter to turn on their water overflows, the home owner will have the sole responsibility to thaw it. Home owners without a water overflow will be subject to By Law No 4, Section 8 A.

The Municipality of Aroostook and or the Aroostook Water Commission will not accept responsibility for any work done or damages incurred.





As required in Section 5(A), any water service rate notice sent by Canada Post that is deemed undeliverable by Canada Post and returned to the Aroostook Water Commission, will result in a notice of the possible termination of water service in 30 days that will be hand delivered and posted on the door of the premises of the water service user.
- (C). As required in Section 5(A), if the water service user has failed to comply with a current valid postal mailing address within the 30 days, a final notice of termination of water services within 10 days, will be posted on the door of the premises of the water service user.
